 her life and from and after her decease I give devise and bequeath all my
 Estate and Effects whatsoever and wheresoever both real and personal
 unto my son Robert Fox Bartrop his heirs executors administrators and
 assigns according to the nature and quality thereof respectively. I hereby
 nominate and appoint my said wife and son Executors and Executors
 of this my Will and hereby revoking and making void all and every in a
 former and other wills and wills by me at any time or times heretofore
 made I do declare this present writing to be and contain my last Will
 and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
 seal this twentieth day of March one thousand eight hundred and
