

I MARY BARTROP of Number 48 Church Walk Worksop in the County of Nottingham Spinster hereby revoke all wills and codicils at any time heretofore made by me and declare this to be my last will.

1. I appoint Sydney William Pennington of Worksop aforesaid Solicitors Clerk and Cecil Newton Graham of Worksop aforesaid Solicitor to be EXECUTORS and trustees of this my will and I declare that the expression "my trustees" shall where the context so admits include the said Sydney William Pennington and Cecil Newton Graham and the survivor of them and other the trustees or trustee for the time being of this my will

2. I bequeath the following specific legacies free of duty (i) To the Victoria Hospital Worksop all my beds sheets blankets counterpanes and other bed linen (ii) To my friend Mary Wheeler the wife of Percy Wheeler of Worksop aforesaid my silver tea set comprising teapot cream jug basin and sugar tongs (iii) To Constance Mellars daughter of my housekeeper Emma Mellars my walnut work table (iv) To my half cousins May Turner of Central Avenue Worksop and Dora Goacher of Worksop the choice in equal shares of all my wearing apparel my table and other household linen not hereby or by any codicil hereto otherwise specifically bequeathed and all articles that may be in any of my chests of drawers bureaux wardrobes and in the dresser drawers and cupboard In my living room and similar articles stored in the attic (except such as may be otherwise specifically disposed of as aforesaid and except any cutlery spoons forks silver or plated articles) and also all my work boxes and baskets and the articles therein and I declare that if any dispute shall arise between the said May Turner and Dora Goacher as to the distribution of any of the aforesaid articles the decision of my trustees shall be final provided always that If any of the afore said things and articles shall not be chosen by either of them the said May Turner and Dora Goacher I give and bequeath the same free of duty to my housekeeper the said Emma Mellars if in my service at the time of my death and if the said Emma Mellars shall not be in my service at my death I declare that the same shall fall into and form part of my residuary estate

3. I direct my trustees to retain the services of my housekeeper the said Emma Mellars if in my service at the time of my death for a period of three months after the date of my death at the same rate of wages which she was receiving at my decease and also during the same period to pay the rent of any cottage which she may be occupying at my death

4. I bequeath the following pecuniary legacies free of duty (i) To the Worksop Victoria Hospital the sum of one thousand pounds to be applied as an endowment fund for the endowment of a bed in the said Hospital to be called "The Mary and Dinah Bartrop Bed" and I direct that a brass plate in memory of Mary and Dinah Bartrop inscribed in such terms as my trustees may approve shall be placed above such bed and I declare that the receipt of the Treasurer for the time being of the said Hospital shall be sufficient discharge for the said sum of one thousand pounds to (i) be applied as aforesaid (ii) To the Royal Infirmary Road Sheffield the sum of one hundred pounds (iii) To Jessops Hospital for Women

Leavygreave Road Sheffield the sum of one hundred pounds (iv) To the Vicar and Churchwardens for the time being of the Priory Church Worksop the sum of five hundred pounds Upon trust to invest the same in any Investments for the time being authorized by law for the investment of trust funds (with power to vary such investments at their discretion) and to apply the income from such investments towards the repair of the fabric and the interior of the said Priory Church (v) To the Vicar and Churchwardens for the time being of the Priory Church Worksop the sum of two hundred pounds towards the restoration of the said Church (vi) To the Vicar and Churchwardens for the time being of St. John Church Worksop the sum of three hundred pounds Upon trust to invest the same in any investments for the time being authorized by law for the investment of trust funds (with power to vary such investments at their discretion) and to apply the income from such investments towards the repair of the fabric and the Interior of the said St. Johns Church (vii) To my housekeeper the said Emma Mellars the sum of one hundred pounds if in my service at the time of my death (viii) To each of them the said Sydney William Pennington and Cecil Newton Graham who shall prove my will the sum of fifty pounds (ix) To Dr Barnardos Homes London the sum of twenty five pounds (x) To the British and Foreign Bible Society the sum of twenty five pounds (xi) To the Society for the propagation of the Gospel the sum of twenty five pounds (xii) To my cousin (George Bartrop now residing in Canada the sum of one hundred pounds(xiii) To my cousin William Bartrop of Carlton Road Worksop the sum of one hundred pounds (xiv) To my cousin Henry Bartrop of Eastgate Worksop the sum of one hundred pounds (xv) To each of them May Hunt of Church Walk Worksop and the said May Turner | and Dora Goacher the sum of fifty pound (xvi) To each of them Horace Newton of Cleethorpes and Bernard Newton of Worksop the sum of twenty five pounds (xvii) To each of them Ethel Newton Mabel Newton and Audrey Newton the three sisters of the said Horace Newton and Bernard Newton the sum of twenty five pounds (xviii) To the Institution known as John Grooms Crippleage of Sekforde Street Clerkenwell the sum of one hundred pounds (xix) To the Worksop and District Cripples Guild one hundred pounds to be used solely for Worksop children (xx) So the Trustees of the Worksop Charities the sum of one hundred pounds to be used by them for such purposes other than educational purposes as are set forth In the scheme dated the third day of July one thousand nine hundred and eight under the seal of the Charity Commissioners (xxi) To the trustees of the Worksop Victoria Jubilee Nurses Institution of Worksop the sum of one hundred pounds (xxii) To the Sheffield Institution of the Blind the sum of one hundred pounds (xxiii) To the Urban District Council of Worksop acting on behalf of the Worksop Burial Board the sum of thirty pounds in perpetuity and the interest of same to be applied towards the keeping in order of the two headstones and the graves of my late father and mother and sisters In the Old Cemetery at Worksop

5. I devise and bequeath all the real and personal estate whatsoever and wheresoever of or to which I shall be possessed or entitled at the time of my death or over which I shall have any general power of appointment or disposition by will (except property otherwise disposed of by this my will or any codicil hereto) unto ay trustees In foe simple and absolutely respectively Upon trust by and out of my ready moneys and the sale or conversion or appropriation of such part or parts of my residuary real and personal estate as shall be required or necessary for the purpose to pay or make provision for my

funeral and testamentary expenses and debts and the legacies bequeathed free of duty as aforesaid and subject as aforesaid my trustees shall stand possessed of the net residue of my real and personal property as aforesaid Upon trust for the Victoria Hospital Worksop absolutely.

6. The said Cecil Newton Graham and any trustee for the time being hereof who shall be a solicitor or engaged in any profession or business shall be entitled to charge and be paid out of the trust estate his usual professional or other charges for work or business done or transacted by him or her firm In the execution or otherwise In relation to the trusts hereof Including therein any work or business which be might as a trustee have been required to do or transact In person IN WITNESS whereof I have to this and the three preceding sheets of paper hereunto set my hand this thirty first day of January one thousand nine hundred and twenty eight - MARY BARTROP Signed by the testatrix the said Mary Bartrop as and to her last will and testament In the presence of us both present at the same time who at her request in her sight and presence and in the presence of each other have here unto subscribed our names as witness - A K S CROSS Solicitor Worksop - JOHN E MARKHAM Clerk to Messrs & Co Solicitors Worksop
